### Our Mission

The Represent Foundation aims to increase access to higher education for students from Malawi. We do this through a combination of mentoring, advocacy, and financial support. We believe that representation from diverse backgrounds enriches the college experience for all.

### Progress


#### **Fundraising and Disbursement**

In 2023, we raised \$12,089.60 and disbursed \$5,481.12 to nine students at six schools.

- \$5,000 Beacom Family Foundation Grant
- \$6,000 Cambridge Charitable Foundation Grant
- \$900.29 from a partnership with Eliza Buckman at Melaleuca Wellness
- \$175 from individual donors
- \$14.31 through sales of *Lucky: An African Student, An American Dream, and a Long Bike Ride.* (Half the proceeds of each sale, \$1.64-\$1.71, go to the Foundation.)

#### Milestones

- Doubled our fundraising outcomes, including two major grants and a recurring donor.
- Recruited seven new Represent Scholars.
- Established a partnership with Peace Corps Malawi to aid in recruitment efforts.
- Completed a Monitoring & Evaluation report to gauge the efficacy of our program.
- Established a social media presence on four platforms.



### Outcomes

Through full and partial scholarships, as well as stipends for school supplies, we helped nine students pursue tertiary education for a year.

Brooke also got to meet with some of the current Represent Scholars – after all, it's much more meaningful to connect with people face-to-face rather than over WhatsApp.





Finally, Brooke had a chance to speak with students at Chikweo CDSS, where she served as a Peace Corps Volunteer English teacher from 2013–2015. She told them about The Represent Foundation and encouraged them to apply.







On the digital side, representfoundation.org had 668 unique visitors, a 126% increase from the previous year, and a total of 725 visits, a 120% increase from 2022. We also established our social media presence; our Facebook page has 1 follower, Instagram 13, X 21, and LinkedIn 48.
